



LAKEHEAD LIGHT HORSE ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP

The Lakehead Light Horse Association (LLHA) is pleased to offer a scholarship to our members who are entering or continuing a post secondary education. This award is funded through our fund raising events and by donations received throughout the year by our sponsors. A scholarship award of Five Hundred dollars is available through an application process. The applications are reviewed by a minimum of two (2) trustees, and one (1) officer (appointed by the trustees), who are not related in any manner to the applicants. The names of this review board will not be publicly disclosed. The successful applicant will be awarded at the year end banquet.

APPLICATION CRITERIA

Individuals may apply if they:

- Have been a member in good standing since August 1 of the year of application.
- Have never received an LLHA scholarship.
- Provide proof of post secondary enrollment.

Applicants must be attending an accredited post secondary educational institute. The scholarship can be applied towards full or part-time studies.

Applicants must fill out the attached application form. Submit a typed essay with a minimum of 500, and a maximum of 750 words which must include:

- Examples of your contributions to the LLHA past or present.
- Where you would like to see the LLHA progress in the near and/or distant future.
- Why you feel you deserve this scholarship.
- How your education could impact the equine or agricultural activities in our area.
- Long term career goals.

Applicants must supply two letters of reference from non family members, and include contact information. References will be contacted by the review board. Please include all current graduating marks/scores.

SUMMARY AND CHECKLIST

- Provide three (3) copies of all materials in a folder with your name and contact information.
- Graduating documents.
- Application form.
- Proof of post secondary enrollment
- Essay.
- Reference letters

Award of this scholarship is based heavily, but not limited to the applicants continued education in equine related studies, veterinary sciences, or agricultural related sciences. The number of volunteer hours donated to the LLHA or local community projects are also a contributing factor in the awards process.

All applications must be submitted to an officer of the Lakehead Light Horse Association by October 1st of the application year.
